# Declaration of Independence

We hold these \_\_\_\_\_ Noun - Plural to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are \_\_\_\_\_ Verb -  
\_\_\_\_\_ Past Tense by their \_\_\_\_\_ Noun with certain \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective Rights, that among these are \_\_\_\_\_ Noun,
