SPAM

Spam is sent by organizations of varying sizes and motivations. Some are large, well-known Plural noun; spam from these sources is sometimes called Noun. A widely-known instance of spamming by a Adjective Noun was Kraft Foods marketing of its Gevalia coffee brand. Advance fee fraud spam such as the Nigerian 419 scam may be sent by a Adjective Noun from a cyber cafe in a developing country. Organized spam gangs operating from Russia or eastern Europe share many features in common with other forms of organized crime, such as Noun battles and Noun Verb ending in ing.

Spammers may engage in deliberate fraud to send out their messages. Spammers often use false names, addresses, phone numbers, and other Adjective information to set up disposable accounts at various Internet service providers. They also often use Adjective or Adjective credit card numbers to pay for these accounts. This allows them to move Adverb from one account to the next as the host ISPs Verb and Verb Plural noun Conjunction Plural noun.
