# Engel v. Vitale (1962)

The Board of Regents for the state of \_\_\_\_\_ Proper Noun authorized a short, voluntary \_\_\_\_\_ Noun for recitation at the start of each school day. This prayer was written by \_\_\_\_\_ Proper Noun state officials to be recited by public schoolchildren.

The \_\_\_\_\_ Proper Noun ruled that this was \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective, because it violated the First Amendments \_\_\_\_\_ Noun clause. By providing the \_\_\_\_\_ Noun, voluntary or not, \_\_\_\_\_ Proper Noun officially approved \_\_\_\_\_ Noun.

This was the first in a series of cases in which the \_\_\_\_\_ Proper Noun used the \_\_\_\_\_ Noun clause to eliminate \_\_\_\_\_ Noun - Plural activities. The \_\_\_\_\_ Noun forbids the sponsorship or encouragement, directly or indirectly, or \_\_\_\_\_ Noun by public school authorities. However, students may \_\_\_\_\_ Verb - Base Form silently to themselves because of freedom \_\_\_\_\_ Verb - Base Form clause.
