This was the first in a series of cases in which the <u>Proper Noun</u> used the <u>Noun</u> clause to eliminate
Noun - Plural activities. The Noun forbids the sponsorship or encouragement, directly or
indirectly, or by public school authorities. However, students may Verb - Base Form silently
to themselves because of freedom <u>Verb - Base Form</u> clause.
