Mark Zuckerbergs Early Years as a Software Developer

Zuckerberg began using computers and writing software as a child in middle school. His father taught him

Adjective Noun Programming in the 1990s, and later hired software developer David Newman

to tutor him privately. Newman calls him a "Noun," adding that it was "tough to stay ahead of him."

Zuckerberg also took a graduate course in Noun - Plural at Mercy College near his home while he was

still in high school. He enjoyed developing computer programs, especially communication tools and games. In

one such program, since his father's Verb - Present ends in ING practice was operated from their home, he built

a software program he called "Proper Noun," which allowed all the computers between the house and

Repeat Last Verb - Present ends in ING office to communicate by Verb - Present ends in ING each other. It is

considered a "primitive" version of AOL's Instant Messenger, which came out the following year.[2]

According to writer Jose Antonio Vargas, "some kids played computer games. Mark Verb - Past Tense them

." Zuckerberg himself recalls this period: "I had a bunch of friends who were Animal (plural). They'd come

over, draw stuff, and I'd build a game out of it." However, notes Vargas, Zuckerberg was not a typical "geek-

klutz," as he later became captain of his prep school Verb - Present ends in ING team and earned a classics

diploma. Napster co-founder Sean Parker, a Adjective Noun, notes that Zuckerberg was "really

into Greek Noun - Plural and all that stuff," recalling how he once quoted lines from the Roman epic poem
