# Ancient Rome Summed Up

According to myth, ancient \_\_\_\_\_ Proper Noun - Place was founded by Romulus and his twin brother \_\_\_\_\_ First Name of a Person. The twins were sons of Mars, the god of \_\_\_\_\_ Noun. Caesar's nephew, Octavian (who took the name Augustus meaning "Adjective one") rose to power with the second triumvirate. After First Name of a Person Antony and his girlfriend, Cleopatra (the last pharaoh of Proper Noun - Place) killed themselves following the Event of Actium, Augustus became the first emperor of Repeat first Place. The empire experienced a long period of Noun that began during his reign, which is called the "Pax Romana." This era lasted for approximately Number years.
