The First Five Amendments of the Bill of Rights

Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; or abridging the freedom of speech, or of the press; or the right of the people _____ Adverb to _____ Present _____ tense verb, and to _____ Present tense verb the government for a redress of grievances.

A well regulated militia, being necessary to the security of a _____ Adjective state, the right of the people to _____ Present tense verb and _____ Present tense verb _____ Noun - Plural, shall not be infringed.

No _____ Occupation shall, in time of peace be _____ Verb - Past Tense in any house, without the consent of the owner, nor in time of war, but in a manner to be prescribed by law.

The right of the people to be secure in their _____ Noun - Plural, _____ Noun - Plural, _____ Noun - Plural, and effects, against _____ Adjective searches and seizures, shall not be violated, and no warrants shall issue, but upon probable cause, supported by oath or affirmation, and _____ Adverb describing the place to be _____ Verb - Past Tense, and the persons or things to be _____ Verb - Past Tense.

No person shall be held to answer for a capital, or otherwise _____ Adjective crime, unless on a presentment or indictment of a grand jury, except in cases arising in the land or naval forces, or in the militia, when in actual service in time of war or public danger; nor shall any _____ Noun be subject for the same offense to be twice put

in jeopardy of life or Part of Body; nor shall be compelled in any criminal case to be a Noun
against himself, nor be deprived of life, liberty, or property, without due process of law; nor shall private
property be taken for public use, without Adjective compensation.
