Forced to Verb - Base Form Preposition humans, Hercules is turned into a half-god and half-mortal after drinking a Adjective potion brewed by Hades' right hand men, Pain and Panic. Now Hercules has the Adjective strength of a god, but is trapped in the body of a Noun, and before he Verb - Present ends in S how to use his power Adverb he goes through a typically adolescent awkward period. In order to become a Noun and return to his home on Mount Olympus, Hercules must Verb - Base Form himself a true hero on Earth.
