Splash Mountain

After a Adjective drop down " Proper Noun Falls", guests enter the Adjective portion of the attraction, where various Adjective animals, such as Noun, Noun - Plural, and Noun - Plural sing the attraction's first Adjective number, "How Do You Verb - Non 3rd Person Singular Present ?". Most of the animals on Proper Noun Mountain were reused from the closed attraction Proper Noun Sings. Brer Rabbit (voiced by Proper Noun Harnell) is seen Verb - Present Tense at Brer Proper Noun Noun - Plural, preceding a " Noun " into the surreal Rainbow Caverns, where characters sing "Everybody's Got a Laughin' Proper Noun ." Brer Adverb then manages to trap Brer Preposition or subordinating conjunction in a beehive. The mood turns Adjective as two mother characters sing the " Proper Noun Lament." The Noun - Plural begin climbing up the final and longer lift hill, passing beneath two Noun - Plural that Adjective guests and tell of foreboding danger. Shortly before the attraction's Noun drop, Brer Proper Noun is seen alongside the hill, about to be eaten by Brer Proper Noun. But Brer Verb - 3rd Person Singular Present outsmarts Proper Noun Fox and Proper Noun Bear by tricking them into throwing him into the Noun patch (where he was Coordinating conjunction and raised). Riders are sent down the final drop into the Adjective patch, mimicking his Noun. The top half of the drop is highly visible from the adjacent areas of the park. A Noun is taken as the Noun begins to fall, and it can be purchased after disembarking from the ride. From the top of the Noun, riders looking toward the splashdown point will notice a full Noun of Noun ahead

of them.

Before the return to the loading area, riders are given a preview of their _____ Determiner that was taken on the final drop via an overhead screen. Professor _____ Proper Noun Owl, an overhead _____ Proper Noun, calls the riders' attention to the screen with various phrases describing the _____ Noun - Plural on their faces. After disembarking from the log, riders enter a " _____ Adjective room," where they preview their on-ride photograph before exiting to _____ Proper Noun Country.
