Trick-or-Treat

Trick-or-treating is a customary practice for children on Halloween in many countries. Children in costumes travel from house to house in order to ask for Noun - Plural with the question Trick or treat? The "trick" is an idle threat to Verb - Base Form the homeowners if no treat is given.

In North America, trick or treat has been a customary Halloween tradition since at least the early 1950s.

Homeowners wishing to participate in it sometimes decorate their Adjective Noun - Plural with artificial spider webs, plastic Noun - Plural and Noun - Plural. Some rather reluctant homeowners would simply leave a Animal in a bowl on the porch, others might be more participative and would even ask an effort from the children in order to provide them with candy.

Guising - children disguised in costumes going from door to door for Noun - Plural and Noun - Plural - predates trick or treat, and is recorded in Scotland at Halloween in 1895, where masqueraders in disguise carrying lanterns made out of Adjective turnips, visit homes to be rewarded with cakes, fruit and Noun - Plural.
