# Declaration Of Independence

We hold these \_\_\_\_\_ Noun - Plural to be \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective, that all men are created \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective, that they are \_\_\_\_\_ Verb - Past Participle by their \_\_\_\_\_ Noun with certain unalienable \_\_\_\_\_ Noun - Plural, that among these are Life, \_\_\_\_\_ Proper Noun and the pursuit of \_\_\_\_\_ Proper Noun.--That to secure these rights, Governments are \_\_\_\_\_ Verb - Past Participle among Men, deriving their just powers from the \_\_\_\_\_ Noun of the \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective, --That whenever any Form of \_\_\_\_\_ Proper Noun becomes destructive of these ends, it is the Right of the People to alter or to \_\_\_\_\_ Verb it, and to institute new \_\_\_\_\_ Noun, laying its foundation on such principles and organizing its \_\_\_\_\_ Noun - Plural in such form, as to them shall seem most likely to effect their \_\_\_\_\_ Noun and Happiness. Prudence, indeed, will dictate that \_\_\_\_\_ Noun - Plural long established should not be changed for light and transient \_\_\_\_\_ Noun - Plural; and accordingly all experience hath shewn, that \_\_\_\_\_ Noun are more disposed to suffer, while evils are sufferable, than to right themselves by abolishing the forms to which they are \_\_\_\_\_ Verb - Past Participle. But when a long train of abuses and usurpations, pursuing invariably the same \_\_\_\_\_ Noun evinces a design to reduce them under absolute \_\_\_\_\_ Noun, it is their right, it is their duty, to throw off such Government, and to provide new Guards for their \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective security.--Such has been the patient sufferance of these Colonies; and such is now the necessity which constrains them to alter their former Systems of \_\_\_\_\_ Proper Noun. The history of the present \_\_\_\_\_ Proper Noun of Great Britain is a history of repeated injuries and \_\_\_\_\_ Noun - Plural, all having in direct object the establishment of an absolute \_\_\_\_\_ Noun over these States. To prove this, let Facts be \_\_\_\_\_ Verb - Past Participle to a candid world.
