He has forbidden his governors to pass laws of immediate and pressing importance, unless suspended in their _____ Verb - Present ends in ING till his _____ Proper Noun should be _____ Noun - Plural; and when so suspended, he has utterly neglected to attend to them.

He has refused to pass other laws for the _____ Proper Noun of large districts of people, unless those people would relinquish the right of representation in the _____ Verb - Base Form, a right inestimable to them and formidable to _____ Verb - Base Form only.

He has called together legislative bodies at _____ Verb - Present ends in S unusual, uncomfortable, and _____ Verb - Present ends in ING from the depository of their public records, for the sole purpose of fatiguing them into compliance with his measures.

He has dissolved _____ Adjective - Ends in EST houses repeatedly, for opposing with manly firmness his invasions on the rights of the people.

He has refused for a long time, after such dissolutions, to cause others to be elected; _____ Proper Noun - Plural the legislative _____ Verb - Past Tense, incapable of annihilation, have returned to the people at large for their exercise; the state remaining in the _____ Adverb exposed to all the dangers of invasion from without, and convulsions within.

He has endeavored to prevent the population of these states _____ Adjective - Ends in EST for that purpose obstructing the laws for naturalization of foreigners; refusing to pass others to encourage _____ Adjective migration hither, and raising the conditions of new appropriations of lands.

He has obstructed the administration of justice, by refusing his assent to _____ Noun - Plural for establishing judiciary powers.

He has made _____ Verb - Present ends in ING dependent on his will alone, for the tenure of their offices, and the amount and payment _____ Adjective - Ends in EST their salaries.

He has erected a multitude of new offices, and sent _____ Noun swarms of officers to _____ Adjective - Ends in

our people, and eat out their Adjective.

He has kept among Proper Noun - Plural, in times of peace, standing Noun without the consent of our legislature.

He has affected Proper Noun render the Noun - Plural independent of and superior to civil power.

He has Noun with others to subject us to a jurisdiction Adjective to our constitution, and unacknowledged by our laws; giving his assent to their acts of pretended legislation:
