Declaration of Independence

When in the Course of Adjective events, it becomes Adjective for one Noun - Plural to dissolve the political Noun - Plural which have connected them with another, and to assume among the powers of the earth, the separate and equal station to which the Laws of Nature and of Nature's God Verb - Non 3rd Person Singular Present them, a decent Noun to the opinions of mankind requires that they should declare the causes which Verb - Non 3rd Person Singular Present them to the separation.

We hold these Noun - Plural to be self-evident, that all Noun - Plural are created Adjective, that they are endowed by their Noun with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the Proper Noun of Adjective.--That to Verb - Base Form these rights, Governments are instituted among Men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the Adjective, --That whenever any Form of Noun becomes Adjective of these ends, it is the Right of the Noun to Happiness. Prudence, indeed, will Verb that Noun - Plural long established should not be changed for light and transient causes; and accordingly all Noun hath shewn, that mankind are more Adjective to suffer, while are sufferable, Preposition or subordinating conjunction to right themselves by Verb - Present Tense the forms to which they are accustomed. But when a long Noun of abuses
