# What is Writing, Sartre

If you want to Verb yourself," writes a Adjective imbecile, "what are you waiting for? Join the Communist Proper Noun." A great writer who engaged himself often and Verb - Past Tense himself still more often, but who has forgotten, said to me, "The worst artists are the most Verb - Past Participle.
