Who Stole the Bunny?

At the Harvard of the <u>Region of the Country</u>, Washington University in St. Louis, humans between the ages of <u>Number</u> and <u>Number</u> gather to drink from the fount of knowledge. Perhaps this is correct. Mr. Boehner has said that the White House and Senator Harry Reid, the majority leader, will now have to take the lead in negotiations. The chance that a fiscal deal will be secured on terms that Democrats find favorable may have increased.

But the chance that there will not be a deal at all may also have increased, or at least not one before protracted negotiations that could harm the economy. The difficulty is in finding any winning coalition of votes in the House of Representatives.
