Lymphatic System

The lymphatic system is a Adjective system in the body. It is a system that returns Adjective plasma to the blood vessels after cleansing it of bacteria and other foreign Noun. It Verb - Base Form a site for Noun by cells of the immune system. The immune system Verb - Base Form against disease by destroying Adjective cells and by inactivating Noun and other foreign chemicals with its Noun. The lymphatic system consists of lymphatic vessels, lymph Noun, and certain other lymphoid organs in the body. The lymph nodes are Verb - Base Form along lymphatic vessels and the lymphatic stream Verb - Present ends in S through them. Lymphatic organs include the Noun, the thymus, Adjective patches, and the spleen. The lymphatic vessels form by Verb - Present ends in ING off veins. Development of immune response occurs around the time of Noun. Lymph transport is aided by the Noun and Adjective pumps and by contraction of smooth muscle in the walls of the lymphatic vessels.
