"The Mom who led the Lewis and Clark"

By the time her husband was hired as an Job, she had already given birth to a boy. They became the only mother-and-baby team to join the Corps of Discovery.

When the Corps left Fort Mandan in 1805, its greatest need was to find Shoshoni Indians who would sell them Noun - Plural for the journey over the Noun - Plural and to the Pacific Ocean. Lewis and Clark believed that she could be a big help by recognizing Noun - Plural along the way and Verb - Base Form to find Shoshoni camps. She did indeed serve as a Verb - Base Form in a few situations, but she helped the expedition in other valuable ways, too.

One of her most important jobs was as an Job. She did not speak Job, but she did speak Noun and Noun. She was an important part of a Adjective team that helped Lewis and Clark to Verb - Base Form with Native Americans.
