Steve Jobs

Steve Jobs helped _____^{Verb} the personal computer in the late 70s. In the early 80s, Jobs was among the first to see the commercial potential of the mouse-driven GUI. After losing a power struggle with Apple's board of _____^{Plural noun} in 1985, Jobs founded NeXT, a _____^{Adjective} _____^{Noun} development company specializing in the higher education and business markets.

In 1996, Apple bought NeXT for US\$402 million, bringing Jobs back to the company he founded. In 1997 he became Apple's interim CEO after the directors lost confidence in _____^{Adjective} _____^{Name of a person} in a boardroom coup. In March of 1998, Jobs immediately terminated a number of projects such as Newton, _____^{Proper noun} and _____^{Proper noun}. In the coming months, many employees developed a fear of _____^{Verb ending in ing} Jobs while riding in the elevator, afraid that they might not have a job when the doors opened. The reality was that Jobs' summary executions were rare, but a handful of victims was enough to terrorize a _____^{Adjective} _____^{Noun}. This practice became known as 'getting Steved.'.
