Four score seven years ago...Wait, doughnuts have been around

Number score Number years ago...Wait, Noun - Plural have been around longer than eighty-seven years ago. In ancient Rome and Greece, cooks would fry strips of pastry dough and coat them with honey or fish sauce. Arab cooks started frying up small portions of unsweetened yeast dough, drenching the plain fried blobs in sugary syrup to sweeten them. The fritters spread into northern Europe in the 1400's and became popular Noun Noun, Noun and the Noun. Eventually Noun - Plural were added to the center of the fritter to create the shape of Noun we're familiar with today.

The hole invention is generally attributed to Proper Noun Hanson Gregory, a Adjective sailor whose Noun made him some Noun for a voyage. There are many different Noun to this story, but the one of the most Adjective ones is when Captain Possessive Adjective Noun hit a sudden storm. He Verb - Past Tense the Noun on one of the spokes on the steering Noun to keep his hands free. The spoke drove a hole through the raw center of the Noun. Captain Proper Noun liked the Noun - Plural better that way, minus the raw center and Noun ! The Noun hole was born. the first printed recipe for doughnuts can be found in an Adjective cookbook dating back to 1803, included as part of an Noun of Proper Noun recipes. Proper Noun took on a patriotic resonance on the front lines of World War I, when Gender Salvation Army workers known as " Noun Girls" would fry and distribute Noun - Plural to the Adjective soldiers fighting in Proper Noun. The doughnut also has a rich history in the Adjective culture. Proper Noun Levitt is responsible for inventing the first automated Noun machine in 1920. Proper Noun were then mentioned as "Hit Food of the Century of Progress" at the 1934 Proper Noun World Fair.

Proper Noun Rosenberg was operating an Adjective catering business in which he sold snacks in converted secondhand trucks. He noticed that doughnuts and coffee were the most common sold. You may not know, but Proper Noun later invented a franchise called the Adjective Kettle. Two years after opening, Adjective changed the store's name to Proper Noun Donuts. There were more than 5,000 Noun - Plural open by the time of his death.

The Noun continues to be a popular breakfast snack with lots of shops that sell this Noun delight. Many places like Tim Proper Noun and Proper Noun Kreme's continue to make the classic Noun, but many others have Verb - Past Participle it. Though the doughnut has a long history, it doesn't

take long to sit back, _____ Verb - Base Form _____, and eat a _____ Noun _____.
