Since the new director's start in Spring 2012, Cheryl Holley, has focused on bringing life and activity back to the seminary. Ms. Holley was inspired to sponsor a workshop when she noticed a problem while speaking and observing parishioners during Mass. "People weren't connecting. The celebration of the Eucharist was being missed," said Ms. Holley.

To address the issue Ms. Holley felt it was the Pastoral Center's duty to bring attention to the fact that as ministers "we are all servants. We are all connected to the celebration of Mass. If we can break open that realization
