Abhor Verb

Regard with disgust and hatred

Syn: detest, hate, loathe, despise

ASL: Hate

I abhor the bullying in schools.

Absurd ADJ

Wildly unreasonable, illogical, or inappropriate

Syn: silly, ludicrous, foolish

ASL: silly, crazy, stupid

The homework was absurd

Anthropologist Noun

The scientific study of the origin, the behavior, and the physical, social and cultural development of humans.

Syn: study of humans

ASL: study people person

The anthropologist focused on culture.

Artifact

N

an object made by a human being, typically an item of cultural or historical interest.

Syn: relic, handiwork, article

The museum contained many artifacts.

Bigot; NOUN, ?a person who is utterly intolerant of any differing creed, belief, or opinion ?[Syns; racist, segregationist, intolerant prejudiced person] The Governor was exposed for the bigot he is.

Bizarre; ADJ ?Markedly unusual in appearance, style, or general character and often involving incongruous or unexpected elements; outrageously strange ?[Syns; eccentric, ludicrous, peculiar, weird,] ?ASL; weird ?Her Halloween costume was bizarre!

Contemptuous; ADJ ?showing or expressing contempt or disdain, disrespectful, scornful attitude? [Syns; on high horse, snobbish, disrespectful] ?ASL; hate, no respect ?The bitter woman's thoughts were contemptuous.

Entreaty; Noun

a serious request for something

Synonyms: appeal, plea, desire

ASL: beg, Verb - Non 3rd Person Singular Present +++

The

President ignored the entreaty from the U.S. people.

Fetish; Noun

a strong and unusual need or desire for something

Synonyms: obsession, mania?ASL: Obsession

The girl had a book fetish.

Imperative; Adjective

very important; expressing a command in a forceful and confident way

Synonyms: forced, mandatory, necessary

ASL: Must (with an emphasis)
