Guinness World Record for *Body Part* transplant patient

A British man has entered the record books as the longest-surviving body part transplant patient.

John Proper Noun, 71, has surpassed the previous Guinness World Record of number years, 11 months and 10 days set by an American man who died in 2009.

Mr Proper Noun was told he had five Noun to live when he underwent the life-saving operation at Harefield Hospital in Middlesex 31 years ago.

He says his record should give hope to others awaiting transplants.

Mr Proper Noun, from Newport Pagnell in Buckinghamshire, said: "I want this world record to be an inspiration to anyone Verb - Present ends in ING a body part transplant and to those who, like me, have been fortunate enough to have had one.
