Adaptation

An adaptation, also called an <u>Adjective</u> trait, in biology is a trait with a current <u>Adjective</u> role in the life history of an <u>Noun</u> that is <u>Verb-Past Tense</u> and evolved by means of natural selection. Adaptation refers to both the current state of being adapted and to the dynamic evolutionary process that leads to the adaptation. Adaptations contribute to the fitness and survival of <u>Noun + Plural</u>. Organisms face a succession of environmental <u>Noun + Plural</u> as they <u>Verb - Base Form</u> and develop and are equipped with an adaptive plasticity as the phenotype of traits <u>Verb - Base Form</u> in response to the imposed conditions. The developmental norm of reaction for any given trait is essential to the correction of adaptation as it affords a kind of biological insurance or resilience to varying environments.
