The Four Children

The wise child asks, "What are the <u>Noun</u>, the <u>Noun</u>, and the laws that God has commanded you to do?" You should reply to him with the laws of pesach: one may not <u>Verb - Base Form</u> any dessert after the paschal sacrifice.

The wicked <u>Noun</u> asks, "What is this service to you?" The child is not including himself and has withdrawn himself from the Jewish community. He is rebuked with the <u>Noun</u> that "It is because God acted for my sake when I left Egypt." The Seder is not for the <u>Adjective</u> child and there would not have been redemption for him.

The simple <u>Noun</u> <u>Verb - Present ends in S</u> "What is this?" You reply, "With a strong hand the

Almighty led us out from Egypt, from the house of bondage."

The child who is too <u>Adjective</u> to ask is told the <u>Noun</u> of Passover "because of what the

Almighty did for me when I left Egypt."
