## Sarah Rosetta Wakeman

Sara Rosetta Wakeman (commonly called Rosetta) was a very <u>Adjective</u> woman during The Civil War. She decided to dress as a <u>Noun</u> and serve in the armed <u>Proper Noun - Plant</u> as a part of the infantry because she thought she'd make more <u>Noun</u>. Her dude name was Lyons Wakeman, and she told everyone that she was <u>Number</u> years old. She sent multiple <u>Noun</u> to home during her time in the army, and they remain <u>Verb - Past Tense</u> to this day. Until about 100 years after the end of the war however, these letters were not open to the public to <u>Verb - Pase Form</u>. Wakeman died on the battlefield on June 19, 1864. Her true gender was never <u>Verb - Past Tense</u> by nurses, causing many to think that it was never discovered she was a <u>Noun</u>.
