Sarah Rosetta Wakeman

because she thought she'd make more Noun. Her dude name was Lyons Wakeman, and she told

everyone that she was Number years old. She sent multiple Noun to home during her time in

the army, and they remain Verb - Past Tense to this day. Until about 100 years after the end of the war

however, these letters were not open to the public to Verb - Base Form. Wakeman died on the battlefield on

June 19, 1864. Her true gender was never Verb - Past Tense by nurses, causing many to think that it was

never discovered she was a Noun.
