# Baby Names and Meanings

First Name - Male

English form of the Late Latin name " Fake word ". This was the name of two apostles in the New Testament. The first was Saint Repeat Last First Name - Male the Verb - Ends in ER, the apostle John's brother, who was Type of execution - Past Tense by a Noun. The second was Repeat Last First Name - Male, the Adjective son of Well-known person - past of present.

Since the 13th century this form of the name has been used in England, though it became more common in Country, where it was borne by several kings, including king Repeat Last First Name - Male VI, who Verb - Past Tense the English throne, thus causing the name to become much more popular.

First Name - Female

English form of the Nationality - Adj name " Fake word ", which means "one who Verb - Present ends in S". In Repeat Last Nationality - Adj mythology Repeat Last First Name - Female was the daughter of Fictional Male and Fictional Female, whose kidnapping was the cause of Historical Event. The name was also borne by the 4th-century Saint Repeat Last First Name - Female, mother of Well-known person - past of present, who supposedly found a/n Adjective Noun during a trip to Country. The name was originally used among early Christians in honor of the saint, as opposed to the classical character.

First Name - Male

Repeat Last First Name - Male means " Adjective Verb - Ends in ER " from Old English. This was the name of two Adjective Occupation of England. It was also borne by two Occupation, including one who, according to tradition, was shot to death with Noun after refusing to Verb - Base Form his Relative.

Famous bearers of the name include the Nationality - Adj poet Repeat Last First Name - Male Last Name, and Sir Repeat Last First Name - Male Hillary, the first person to Verb - Base Form Famous Landmark.

First Name - Female

From the Greek word meaning " Noun ". In the Old Testament Apocrypha this is the name of a woman falsely accused of Verb - Present ends in ING Preposition a Noun. The prophet Daniel clears her name by Verb - Present ends in ING her accusers. It also occurs in the New Testament belonging to a woman
