# The Gettysburg Address

Number score and Number years ago our Noun - Plural brought forth on this  
Noun, a new Noun, Verb - Past Tense in Liberty, and dedicated to the proposition that all  
Noun - Plural are created Adjective.

Now we are engaged in a Noun civil Verb - Present Tense, testing whether that Coordinating  
conjunction, or any Verb - Past Tense so conceived and so dedicated, can Adverb endure. We are  
met on a Adjective Noun of that Noun. We have come to Verb a portion of  
that Noun, as a Adjective resting place for those who here gave their Noun - Plural that  
that Noun might Verb. It is altogether Adjective and Adjective that we should  
do this.

But, in a larger sense, we can not dedicate -- we can not consecrate -- we can not hallow -- this Noun.  
The Adjective Noun - Plural, living and dead, who Verb - Past Tense here, have consecrated it  
, far above our Adjective Noun to add or detract. The Noun will Adverb note,  
nor Adverb remember what we say here, but it can never Verb what they did here. It is for us  
the living, rather, to be dedicated here to the Adjective Noun which they who Verb -  
Past Tense here have thus far so Adverb advanced. It is rather for us to be here dedicated to the  
Adjective Noun remaining before us -- that from these honored Noun we take  
increased
