Proper Noun age hierarchies and life stages are mediated through various Noun - Plural , as seen in other cultures across the globe. While such rites are Adjective and Adjective , they have Verb - Past Participle form and meaning through the decades. Male Noun - Plural , around the ages of 15 to 25, continue to attend Adjective "initiation schools" where they are Adverb Verb - Past Participle and learn cultural concepts of masculinity, patriarchy, and Noun . However, these schools have undergone many changes throughout history and are not Adjective across the geographical range of Language speakers. Though many of the ritual practices at these schools are Adverb Adjective , they always include Noun . The schools may last anywhere from Length of Time to Length of Time as the initiate Verb - Present ends in S . During the healing process, traditional Noun - Plural Verb the initiates and socialize them into Xhosa ideologies of Noun . After attending an initiation school the boy is recognized as a Adjective Noun in Xhosa society. This transition is not merely rhetorical: the initiate is now able to Verb , Verb , and Verb meant exclusively for men. However, some Noun - Plural argue that the primary driver of this ritual has shifted in recent decades, in that demonstrations of Noun among peer groups have Verb - Past Participle the importance of gaining adult community rights and Noun - Plural .
