More Misplaced & Dangling Modifiers

In English, modifiers describe a word or make its meaning more specific. A misplaced modifier is a phrase or clause placed Adverb in a sentence so that it appears to modify or refer to an unintended word. A dangling modifier is a modifier that has nothing to modify. Here are examples:

The waiter served a Food to the woman that was well Verb - Past Tense.

She put the straw Noun on her Part of Body, which was obviously too Adjective.

While at Noun, Name house Verb - Past Tense down to a pile of Noun - Plural.

Adjective with Food Liquid, Name Verb - Past Tense the Food

as he Verb - Past Tense to Noun.

Professor Last Name, who was late with another essay, Verb - Past Tense for the slacker student.

Name and Name have almost been Verb - Past Tense for Number years.
