maraschino cherys

n the United States, a maraschino cherry is a preserved, sweetened cherry, typically Verb - Past Participle from Adjective sweet Noun - Plural such as the Royal Ann, Rainier, or Gold varieties. In their Adjective form, the cherries Verb - Non 3rd Person Singular Present first preserved in a brine solution usually Verb - Present Tense sulfur dioxide and calcium chloride to bleach the fruit, then soaked in a suspension of food Noun (common red Noun dye, FD&C Proper Noun 40), sugar syrup, and other components.[citation needed]

Maraschino cherries are an ingredient in many Verb - Present Tense, giving them the nickname: "Adjective Noun - Plural." As a garnish, they Adverb are used to decorate Verb - Past Participle yogurt, baked ham, cakes, pastry, Noun - Plural, milkshakes, ice Noun sundaes, and ice cream Noun - Plural. They are frequently included in canned fruit Noun. [1] They are also used as an accompaniment to sweet Noun, and sometimes, along with some Preposition or subordinating conjunction the Noun " Noun," put into a Noun of Coca-Cola to make an old-fashioned or homemade "Cherry Coke".
