Side of the Moon (1973), Wish You Were Here (1975), (1977), The (1977), The (1979)
and The Final Cut (1983).
Wright left Pink Floyd in 1979, followed by Waters in 1985, declaring it a "
Gilmour and Mason continued as Pink Floyd; Wright rejoined them as a musician and, later,

member. The three produced more albums, A Adjective Lapse of Noun (1987)
and The Division (1994), and toured until After nearly two decades of acrimony,
Pink Floyd reunited with Waters in for a performance at the global awareness event Live
, but Gilmour and Waters have since stated they have no plans to reunite as a band again. Barret
died in and Wright in 2008. A new Pink Floyd studio album recorded without Waters partially
originating from Noun-Plural recorded in 1993-1994, The Endless Noun, was released in
Pink Floyd was inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in 1996, and the Country
Music Hall of Fame in 2005. By 2013, the band had sold more than million records worldwide,
