Martin Proper Noun King Jr. was born on January 15, 1929, in Atlanta, Georgia. King, both a Baptist minister and civil-rights activist, had a seismic impact on race relations in the United States, Proper Noun in the mid-1950s. Among many efforts, King headed the SCLC. Through his activism, he played a pivotal role in ending the legal segregation of African-American citizens in the South and other areas of the nation, as well as the creation of Proper Noun Civil Rights Act of 1964 and the Proper Noun Rights Act of 1965. King received the Nobel Peace Prize in 1964, among several other honors. King was assassinated in April 1968, and continues to be Proper Noun as one of the most lauded Proper Noun leaders in history, often referenced by his 1963 speech, "I Have a Dream."
