Facebook has removed a "feeling \_\_\_\_\_" emoji from its website after its presence caused a backlash from a group that said it promoted "\_\_\_\_\_."

" We've heard from our community that listing 'feeling \_\_\_\_\_' as an option for status updates could reinforce negative \_\_\_\_\_ image, particularly for people struggling with eating \_\_\_\_\_," a Facebook spokeswoman wrote. "So we're going to remove 'feeling \_\_\_\_\_' from the list of options. We'll continue to listen to feedback as we think about ways to help people express themselves on Facebook."
