of local interest. Some examples of optional elements include: air Noun, recreation, community Noun, or public Noun - Plural.

Although general plans are not required to Verb - Base Form a standard Noun, many Verb - Base Form similar features. Some of the things to look for in the written portion of a general plan are Noun - Plural (abstract and general expressions of community Noun - Plural), Noun - Plural (Adjective intermediate Noun - Plural in attaining a Noun), Noun - Plural (specific Noun - Plural that guide Noun Verb - Present ends in ING), and implementation Noun - Plural (Noun - Plural of how the Noun - Plural, Noun - Plural, and Noun - Plural are to be put into Noun). Many plans also contain Adjective information about the Noun, such as Noun projections, traffic Noun - Plural, natural Noun - Plural, Noun history, and Noun characteristics.
