THE GENERAL PLAN

The Adjective plan is a community's blueprint for Noun development. It Verb - 3rd Person

Singular Present a community's Noun Noun - Plural and policies. It also is the foundation for land use decisions made by the planning Noun, city council, or board of Noun - Plural.

A general Noun consists of at least two Noun - Plural. It must Verb a written Noun describing the community's goals, Noun - Plural, and policies for Noun. It must also contain a Noun (or Noun - Plural) and diagrams Verb - Present Tense the generalized Noun of land uses, the road Noun, Adjective hazard areas, the Adjective space system, and other policy Noun - Plural that can be illustrated (Adjective Code Section 65302). The maps and Noun - Plural must work together with the Adjective portions of the plan to establish a clear Noun of the community's Noun.

The Adjective plan must Verb - Base Form at least Adjective components (called mandatory Noun - Plural) addressing a set of Adjective planning issues (Government Code Section 65302).

Each city and county Verb - 3rd Person Singular Present the Adjective importance of these issues to their local Noun - Plural and decides how they are to be Verb - Past Participle in the general plan. They may also Adverb adopt additional Noun - Plural, called Adjective Noun - Plural, covering subjects
