Pencil and \_\_\_\_\_ Noun English proficiency \_\_\_\_\_ Noun measure reading, writing and listening abilities, but neglect the fourth and possibly the most \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective ability in a \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective classroom -- \_\_\_\_\_ Verb - Present ends in ING .

To fill this gap, Vericant's verified \_\_\_\_\_ Noun interviews were developed to help admission officers better \_\_\_\_\_ Verb - Base Form their applicant's spoken English \_\_\_\_\_ Noun and non-cognitive skills. The only problem was evaluations were \_\_\_\_\_ Adverb and applicants received little \_\_\_\_\_ Noun on their abilities.

Realizing our \_\_\_\_\_ Noun could be used to accurately assess English ability, we are adding a formal spoken English \_\_\_\_\_ Noun called the Vericant \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective that starts with S \_\_\_\_\_ Noun that starts with E \_\_\_\_\_ Noun that starts with E or SEE.

With the SEE, admission \_\_\_\_\_ Noun - Plural now have a standardized measurement of applicant's spoken English abilities and \_\_\_\_\_ Noun - Plural will quickly receive feedback on their spoken English ability.

Vericant's SEE is a holistic \_\_\_\_\_ Noun of how \_\_\_\_\_ Noun is used for the social purposes of real-life communication, rather than just the speaker's technical mastery of \_\_\_\_\_ Noun and \_\_\_\_\_ Noun. In other words, the SEE reflects a speaker's ability to communicate \_\_\_\_\_ Adverb and \_\_\_\_\_ Adverb in a conversational

The SEE ranges from Levels 1-6, with Level 1 reflecting an extremely limited conversational \_\_\_\_\_ Noun \_\_\_\_\_,

and Level 6 reflecting the \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective \_\_\_\_\_ Adverb \_\_\_\_\_ ability of a well-spoken, highly-educated \_\_\_\_\_ Noun \_\_\_\_\_.

SEE Levels are based on the SEE Simplified Rubric, developed from the Common \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective \_\_\_\_\_ Framework of Reference for Languages. Like the CEFR, our \_\_\_\_\_ Noun \_\_\_\_\_ approaches English speaking with the philosophy of \_\_\_\_\_ Noun \_\_\_\_\_ as communicative - that is, language is about social \_\_\_\_\_ Noun \_\_\_\_\_.

Vericant's SEE score reflects an interviewee's spoken English ability as \_\_\_\_\_ Verb - Past Tense \_\_\_\_\_ analytically across five \_\_\_\_\_ Noun - Plural \_\_\_\_\_: Vocabulary Range, Grammatical Accuracy, Fluency, Conversational Interaction, and Coherence. Scoring is completed by two individual \_\_\_\_\_ Noun - Plural \_\_\_\_\_ extensively trained on the SEE Detailed Rubric. Final SEE Scores are \_\_\_\_\_ Verb - Past Tense \_\_\_\_\_ to both institutions and applicants to an accuracy of one decimal point.
