She signed a recording contract \_\_\_\_\_ Preposition or subordinating conjunction \_\_\_\_\_ Republic Records and \_\_\_\_\_ Verb - Past Tense \_\_\_\_\_ her debut studio album Yours Truly in 2013, which debuted at number one on the US Billboard 200. The album's lead single, "The Way", reached the top-ten of the Billboard Hot 100, with critics comparing her wide vocal range to Mariah Carey's.
