# Star Wars

Star Wars is an \_\_\_\_\_ epic space opera franchise, centered on a film series created by George Lucas.

It depicts the \_\_\_\_\_ of various characters "a long time \_\_\_\_\_ in a galaxy far, far away".

The series began in 1977 with the release of \_\_\_\_\_ film Star \_\_\_\_\_ (subtitled Episode IV: A New Hope in 1981[2][3][4]) by 20th Century Fox, which became a \_\_\_\_\_ pop culture phenomenon. It was followed by the similarly successful sequels The Empire Strikes Back (1980) and Return of the Jedi (1983); these three films constitute the \_\_\_\_\_ Star Wars trilogy. A prequel trilogy was later released between 1999 and 2005, which received a more mixed reaction \_\_\_\_\_ critics and fans in comparison to the original trilogy. All six films were nominated for or won \_\_\_\_\_ Awards, and \_\_\_\_\_ commercial successes, with a combined box office revenue of \$4.38 billion,[5] making Star Wars the fourth highest-grossing film series.[6]

The series has spawned an extensive media franchise--the Star Wars expanded universe--including books, television series, computer and video games, and comic books, \_\_\_\_\_ in significant development of the series's fictional universe. Star Wars also holds a Guinness World Records title for the "Most successful film merchandising franchise." \_\_\_\_\_ 2012, the total value of the Star Wars franchise was estimated at USD \$30.7 billion, including box-office receipts as well as profits from their video games and DVD sales.[7]

In 2012, The Walt Disney Company acquired Lucasfilm for \$4.06 billion and announced three new Star Wars films; \_\_\_\_\_ Determiner first film of that trilogy, Star Wars: The Force Awakens, was released in 2015.[8] 20th Century Fox retains the physical \_\_\_\_\_ Noun rights to the first two Star Wars trilogies, owning permanent rights for the original 1977 film and holding the \_\_\_\_\_ Noun - Plural to \_\_\_\_\_ Proper Noun I-III, V and VI until May 2020.[9][10] Walt Disney Studios owns digital distribution \_\_\_\_\_ Noun - Plural to all the Star \_\_\_\_\_ Proper Noun - Plural films, excluding A New Hope.[10][11]
