The Great Wall of China

Perhaps the most Adjective symbol of Proper Noun and its Adjective and vivid Noun, the Great Proper Noun of Proper Noun actually consists of numerous Noun - Plural and Noun - Plural, many running Adverb to each other. Originally conceived by Proper Noun Qin Shi Huang (c. Number B.C.) in the third Noun B.C. as a means of preventing incursions from barbarian Noun - Plural into the Chinese Proper Noun, the Noun is one of the most Adjective construction projects ever Verb - Past Participle. The best-known and Adjective section of the Proper Noun Wall was Verb - Past Participle in the 14th through 17th Noun - Plural A.D., during the Ming Noun (1368-1644). Though the Proper Noun Wall never Adverb prevented Noun - Plural from entering Proper Noun, it came to function more as a Adjective barrier between Chinese Noun and the Noun, and remains a Adjective symbol of the Noun - Plural enduring Noun.
