When the seat belt sign _____ Verb - Present ends in S, you must fasten your seat belt. _____ Verb - Base Form the metal fittings one into the other, and tighten by pulling on the loose end of the strap. To _____ Verb - Base Form your seat belt, lift the _____ Adjective - Ends in EST portion of the buckle. We suggest that you keep your seat belt _____ Adjective throughout the flight, as we may experience _____ Noun.

There are several _____ Adjective exits on this aircraft- forward, aft, and over each _____ Noun. Please take a few moments now to locate your nearest _____ Noun. In some cases, your nearest Repeat Last Noun may be behind you. If we need to evacuate the aircraft, floor-level _____ Noun - Plural will guide you towards the Repeat Last Noun. Doors can be opened by moving the _____ Noun in the direction of the _____ Noun. Each door is equipped with an _____ Adjective slide which may also be detached and used as a _____ Adjective raft.

Oxygen and the air pressure are always being monitored. In the event of a _____ Event, an oxygen _____ Noun will automatically appear in front of you. To start the flow of oxygen, pull the Repeat Last Noun towards you. Place it firmly over your _____ Part of Body and _____ Part of Body, secure the _____ Adjective band.

behind your head, and breathe normally. Although the bag does not inflate, oxygen is flowing to the Repeat Last

Noun. If you are travelling with a Animal or someone who requires assistance, secure your Repeat Last
Noun first, and then assist the other person. Keep your Repeat Last Noun on until a Adjective crew
member advises you to remove it.

In the event of an Event, please assume the bracing position. Lean forward with your hands on top of
your Part of Body and your Part of Body against your Part of Body. Ensure your
Part of Body are flat on the floor.

A Adjective vest is located in a Noun under your Noun or between the Noun -
Plural. When instructed to do so, open the Adjective pouch and remove the vest. Slip it over your
Part of Body. Pass the Noun - Plural around your Part of Body and adjust at the front. To
inflate the vest, pull firmly on the Adjective cord, only when leaving the aircraft. If you need to refill the
vest, blow into the Noun - Plural. Use the Noun and Noun to attract attention. Also, your
seat bottom cushion can be used as a Noun device. Pull the cushion from the seat, slip your
Part of Body into the straps, and hug the cushion to your Part of Body.

At this time, your portable Adjective devices must be set to Noun mode until an announcement
is made upon arrival.

We'd like to remind you that this is a non-smoking flight. Tampering with, disabling, or destroying the

Adjective detectors located in the Location is prohibited by First Name of a Person.

You will find this and all the other safety information in the card located in the seat Noun in front of

you. We strongly suggest you read it before Event. If you have any questions, please don't hesitate to

ask one of our crew Animal (plural). We wish you all an Adjective flight.
