Measured Moments

My mother grew up in a very wealthy Noun in Massachusetts, for her father was an Noun at MIT as an engineer. He died very young and there was a series of unfortunate events that took place in her Noun that left them a little more economically disadvantaged. As my Noun grew older, she developed a mental illness, something her family had been unable to deal with.
