# Hasan Minhaj's Speech at the White House Correspondents Dinner

Hasan Minhaj, of Comedy Central's "The Daily Show," ended the White House Correspondents' Dinner

Saturday night by \_\_\_\_\_ Verb Present ends in ING \_\_\_\_\_ President Trump in a night that mostly focused on the First Amendment.
