

Mayor's Letter for Capital Commitment 2017

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Dear DCPS Community:

Just over a decade ago, our city made the choice to transform the way public education in the District of Columbia works for our students, _____ Noun Plural _____, and _____ Noun Plural _____. In order to set more young Washingtonians up for _____ Noun _____ in school and in life, we made the choice to invest in the modernization of _____ Adjective _____ buildings throughout our city while also looking at every _____ Noun _____ of how teaching and learning was happening in our schools.

DCPS continues to be the fastest improving urban school district in the country, and a recent report confirmed that our schools have made significant gains on student achievement, graduation rates, Advanced Placement exams, student satisfaction, and Noun.
