It would be fatal for the nation to Verb the urgency of the moment. This sweltering summer of the Negro's legitimate discontent will not Verb until there is an invigorating autumn of freedom and equality. Nineteen sixty-three is not an end, but a beginning. And those who Verb that the Negro needed to Verb off steam and will now be content will have a rude awakening if the nation returns to business as usual. And there will be neither rest nor tranquility in America until the Negro is granted his citizenship rights. The whirlwinds of revolt will continue to shake the foundations of our nation until the bright day of justice emerges.

But there is something that I must \_\_\_\_\_ Verb to my people, who stand on the warm threshold which leads into the palace of justice: In the process of gaining our \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective place, we must not be guilty of wrongful deeds. Let us not seek to satisfy our thirst for freedom by drinking from the cup of \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective and \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective. We must forever \_\_\_\_\_ Verb our struggle on the high plane of dignity and discipline. We must not allow our creative protest to degenerate into physical violence. Again and again, we must rise to the majestic heights of meeting \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective force with soul force.

The \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective new militancy which has engulfed the \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective community must not lead us to a distrust of all white people, for many of our white brothers, as evidenced by their presence here today, have come to realize that their destiny is tied up with our destiny. And they have come to realize that their freedom is inextricably bound to our freedom.

We cannot walk alone.

And as we walk, we must make the pledge that we shall always march ahead.

We cannot turn back.

There are those who are asking the devotees of civil rights, 'When will you be \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective \_\_\_\_\_?' We can never be \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective \_\_\_\_\_ as long as the Negro is the victim of the \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective \_\_\_\_\_ horrors of police brutality. We can never be \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective \_\_\_\_\_ as long as our bodies, heavy with the fatigue of travel, cannot gain lodging in the motels of the highways and the hotels of the cities. \*We cannot be satisfied as long as the negro's basic mobility is from a \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective \_\_\_\_\_ ghetto to a \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective \_\_\_\_\_ one. nothing for which to vote. No, no, we are not \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective \_\_\_\_\_ and we will not be \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective \_\_\_\_\_ until 'justice rolls down like waters, and righteousness like a mighty stream.'

I am not unmindful that some of you have come here out of \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective \_\_\_\_\_ trials and tribulations. Some of you have come fresh from \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective \_\_\_\_\_ jail cells. And some of you have come from areas where your quest -- quest for freedom left you battered by the storms of persecution and staggered by the winds of police brutality. Go back to Mississippi, go back to Alabama, go back to South Carolina, go back to Georgia, go back to Louisiana, go back to the slums and ghettos of our \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective \_\_\_\_\_ cities, knowing that somehow this situation can and will be changed.

Let us not wallow in the valley of despair, I say to you today, my friends.

And so even though we face the difficulties of today and tomorrow, I still have a dream. It is a dream deeply rooted in the American dream.

I have a dream that one day this nation will rise up and live out the \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective meaning of its creed: 'We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective \_\_\_\_\_.'

I have a dream that one day on the red hills of Georgia, the sons of former slaves and the sons of former slave owners will be able to sit down together at the table of brotherhood.

have a dream that one day even the state of Mississippi, a state sweltering with the heat of injustice, sweltering with the heat of oppression, will be transformed into an oasis of freedom and justice.

I have a dream that my four Adjective children will one day live in a nation where they will not be judged by the color of their skin but by the content of their character.

I have a dream today!

I have a dream that one day, down in Alabama, with its Adjective racists, with its governor having his lips dripping with the words of Big word, and Big word, -- one day right there in Alabama Adjective black boys and black girls will be able to join hands with Adjective white boys and white girls as sisters and brothers.

I have a dream today!

I have a dream that one day every valley shall be exalted, and every hill and mountain shall be made

Adjective the rough places will be made Adjective and the crooked places will be made  
Adjective; 'and the glory of the Lord shall be revealed and all flesh shall see it Adjective.'

This is our hope, and this is the faith that I go back to the South with.

With this faith, we will be able to hew out of the mountain of despair a stone of hope. With this faith, we will be  
able

to transform the \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective \_\_\_\_\_ discords of our nation into a beautiful symphony of brotherhood. With  
\_\_\_\_\_ Adjective \_\_\_\_\_ faith, we will be able to work together, to pray together, to struggle together, to go to jail  
together, to stand up for freedom together, knowing that we will be free one day.

And this will be the day -- this will be the day when all of God's children will be \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective \_\_\_\_\_ to sing with  
new meaning:
