The Witcher 3: The Wild Hunt

The Wild Hunt, or <u>Noun Plural</u> of Mörhogg, as they are called in <u>Location</u> , was widely believed
to be a group of <u>Noun Plural</u> <u>Verb Present ends in ING</u> in the sky. They were described by common folk
as a cavalcade of wraiths on <u>Adjective</u> horses galloping across the sky and serving as an <u>Noun</u>
of war. In fact, they are a group of Aen Elle <u>Proper Noun Plural</u> from Tir ná Lia who also call themselves the
Dearg Ruadhri in their native Elder Speech, meaning <u>Adjective</u> Riders. They are led by general, and later
king Eredin Bréacc Glas, commonly known as the <u>Noun</u> of the Wild Hunt. Their true purpose was to
find and capture from other worlds, such as that of the Aen Seidhe, to serve the Alder
Proper Noun Plural
During the Conjunction of the Noun Plural, part of the elves from the Adjective world, later
described as the Aen Seidhe world, left their kin and through <u>Noun Plural</u> came to a new world. They took
the new world for their own and started to call themselves Aen Elle - the Alder folks. That world however was
inhabited by two intelligent species - humans and <u>Animal (plural)</u> . Elves started to wage war with both of
them and eventually <u>Adverb</u> <u>Verb Past Tense</u> all the humans and their <u>Noun Plural</u> .
For some time, everything was <u>Adjective</u> for the elves and their <u>Noun</u> thrived. They built a
Adjective palace known as Tir ná Lia that served as their <u>Noun</u> .
