Thomas Jefferson's Early Life

Thomas Jefferson, author of the American Declaration of Independence and the third U.S. president, was born
on April 13, 1743, at the Shadwell plantation located just outside of Charlottesville, Virginia near the western
edge of Great Britain's American Empire.
Jefferson was born into one of the most families of Virginia's planter elite. His mother, Jane
Randolph Jefferson, was a member of the Randolph clan, a family that claimed Noun
from English and Scottish royalty. His father, Peter Jefferson, was a successful farmer as well as a
skilled surveyor and cartographer who produced the first map of the Province of Virginia. The
young Jefferson was the third born of siblings.
As a boy, Thomas Jefferson's favorite pastimes were playing with the, practicing the violin
and He began his formal education at the age of nine, studying Latin and
Noun Plural at a local private school run by the Reverend William Douglas. In 1757, at the age of 14, he
took up study of as well as literature and mathematics with the Reverend
James Maury.
In 1760, having learned all he could from Maury, Jefferson left home to attend the College of William and Mary
in Williamsburg . Although it was the second oldest college in America (after only Harvard), William and Mary
