# The History Behind July 4th

In the beginning of U.S.'s history, 13 colonies were ruled by the King of England, King \_\_\_\_\_ Full Name of a Person

Things didn't happen overnight. It took years for the final draft of the Declaration to be written. At the same time, the American Revolution was taking place. In 1783 the war finally ended and Independence Day was made an official holiday.
