Word Blanks Pandemic Chess

During the pandemic, chess playing has mostly happened online. Websites offering online play have grown over the last six months. And many chess players wonder when it will be safe to return to Adjective play.

The scourge of online chess is cheating. While playing online, a player might have another computer or phone running chess software and look at the moves generated by that software. Even just Verb Present ends in ING once or twice during the game, at key points, might results in more wins for the Noun.

Many people won't feel safe returning to Adjective chess until there is a Noun for Covid-19. For now, over-the-board chess players wear Noun Plural. Some tournament directors provide a barrier, placed halfway between the white and black sides of the board. Between rounds, Noun Plural can be sanitized.

Even before the pandemic, playing online was very popular. During the pandemic, online chess became the most popular form of chess playing. Perhaps it will remain so after the pandemic.
