5S Red Tag Event

Red tags used in a scheduled 5S event. The first step is that a 5S Noun is Verb Past Tense and can be anywhere from 3 to 10 members depending on the company size. The team then selects an Noun that needs organizational improvement. Before they start the event, they need to Verb Base Form and have on hand 100 or more red Noun. As the team Verb Present ends in S through the items a red tag is placed on items that are not needed or not sure of use or not used in a long time. The 5S team member who Verb Present ends in S puts their Noun on it and conducts the follow up within a specified period of time to determine if it is to be kept (and what it is used for) or if it should be thrown away. All items with red tags from the event are Verb Past Tense in a designated Noun called the 5S red tag holding area. The group Verb Present ends in S again at a set future date to determine what to do with all the red tagged items.
